
### Methodology

- Telephone survey 89 questions
- Co-sponsored by Rapp Strategies and Morris Leatherman
- Conducted in mid-February 2022
- 800-sample matches demographics of Minnesota adults
- Margin of Error is ± 3.5%
- Reminder surveys are a snapshot in time



### "Prairie Home Optimism" Among Minnesotans

- Key issue: Inflation
- Unique issue: Climate Change
- Trusted party on key issue: D
- <u>Biden job approval</u>: 87%
- Walz job approval: 92%
- <u>Trust cable TV news</u>: 69%



#### "Prairie Home Optimism"

- <u>Key issue</u>: Inflation
- <u>Unique issue</u>: Mental Health Crisis
- Trusted party on key issue: Slightly D on key issues
- Biden job approval: 44%
- Walz job approval: 71%
- Trust cable TV news: 53%



- 27% are using social media more than one year ago, 28% less
- Nearly ½ of increased social media use comes from 18-34 age group



Party ID, likelihood to support Walz, and generic ballots for Congress and state legislature






